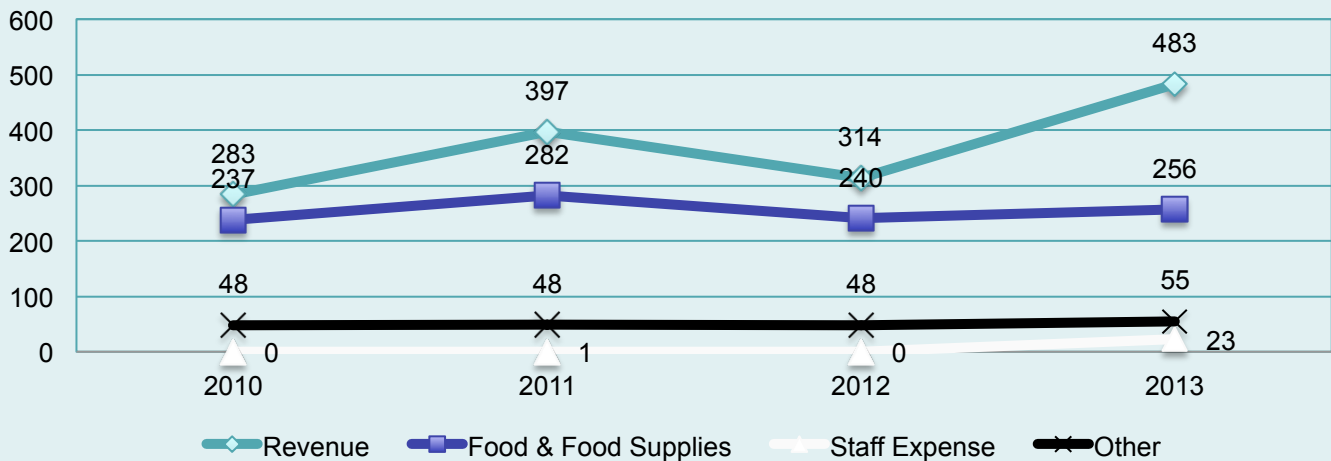
### Our Vision and Mission

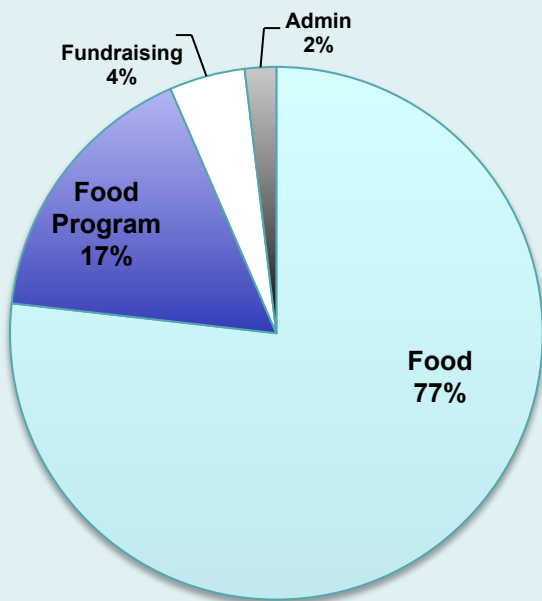


Revenue was much higher in 2013 due to continued success with the building fund campaign. Food, Food Supplies, and all Other Expenses (excluding Staff Expense) were up slightly over the previous year. Staff Expense was incurred for the first time in 2013 for our part-time Executive Director. **94%** of all expense incurred in 2013 was devoted to food and food supplies.

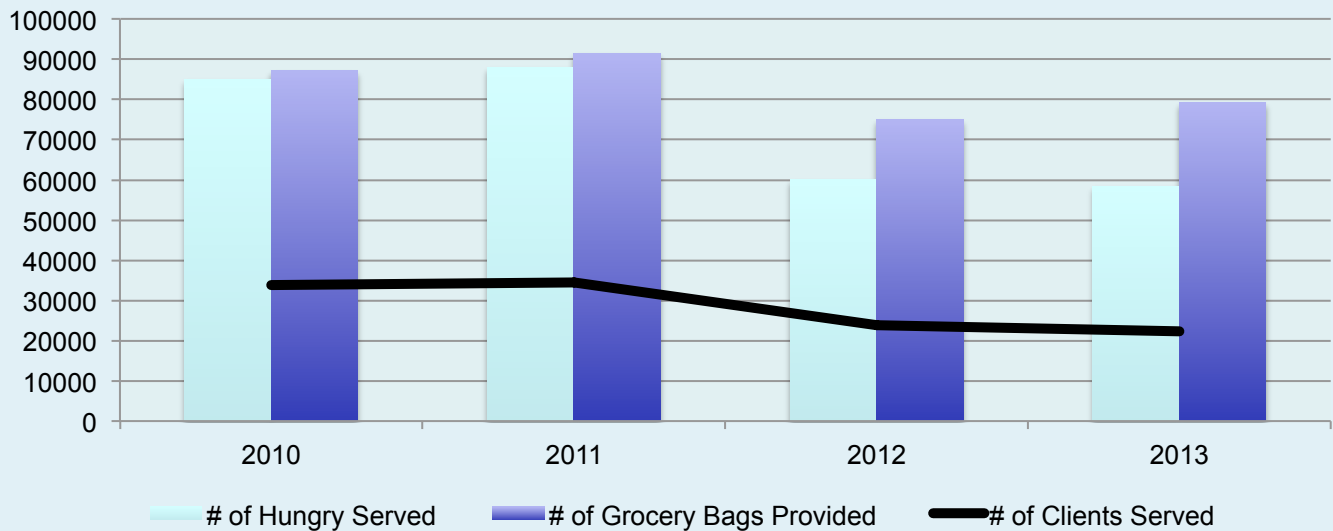
